Our Outreach...

Apartment Church

We have continued to see our church go outside the walls of our apartments. God has been moving in Gaby's heart and it is great to see her being a light in the neighborhood. She is encouraging friends by reading the Word of God to them and sharing the love of Christ with them in her special way. Carolina told her one day, "I am not going to the psychologist anymore. The only place I can find truth is in the Bible. It is el Libro de la Verdad." They went and bought a Bible together, for her and her boyfriend too.

In our Sunday meetings, we have been going through a series on "Events before the Cross." It has been a good time of growing deeper in the Word of God, and also a time of challenge for those who do not yet know Christ.

Please pray with us for three crucial areas: Pray for Caro and others that are being challenged with the truth. We have outgrown our space and we sense that for our ministry to expand we need to quickly find the place that God has for us. Also, we are praying for God's provision for a person to lead our time of worship through songs and praise.

Small Group Bible Study

We have continued to be encouraged this month through our small group Bible study that meets on Thursdays. The consistency in attending the Bible study by Sergio and Ceci, Gabi Bertolino, and Fernando Mansilla has allowed us not only to deepen our relationship with them, but also be able to understand more about where they are at in their faith and what questions they are struggling with.
